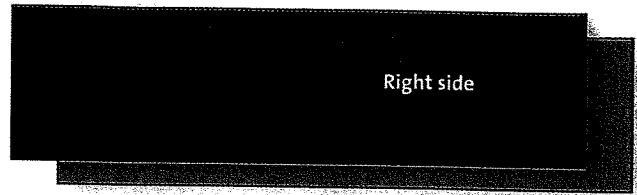


# How to Wear



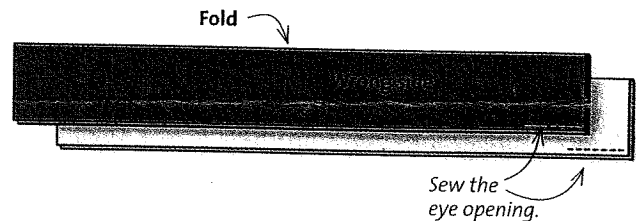
## KEEP-IT-TOGETHER SCARF

Requirements: ½ yard of two coordinating fabrics  
Scissors  
Sewing machine  
Hand needle and thread

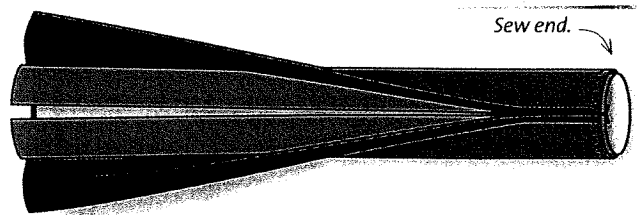


Step 1 Cut 2 rectangles of the same size.  
eg. 9" x 43"

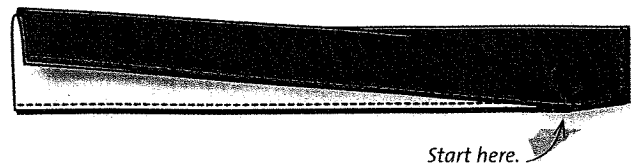
Step 2 Sew the eye opening 4-3/4" from  
end  
Press seam open.



Step 3 Turn 2 tube right side out.  
Place it inside the other tube.  
Sew end together.



Step 4 Sew the layers in pairs.  
Begin at the last stitch of the eye  
seam and sew through both layers  
to the end of the scarf. Then repeat  
on opposite side.



Step 5 Turn the scarf right side out  
through the opening in the end.  
Press Scarf and slip stitch end  
closed.



## LUNCH SACK GIFT BAGS

Requirements: 2 coordinating fat quarters  
3/8 yard light quilt batting

From print A cut

- 2 10x11" bag body rectangles
- 1 1-1/8"x3" bias strip

From print B cut

- 2 10x11" lining rectangles

From batting cut

- 2 10x11" rectangles

1. Baste batting rectangles to wrong side of bag body rectangles.
2. Cut 1-1/2" square from each bottom corner of bag body. Do the same on the lining pieces. Diagram 1
3. Quilt a design if desired on the front of one of the body rectangles. Appliqué name or just leave plain.
4. Fold bias strip into a tape and stitch together. Attach to centre top of back body rectangle. Diagram 2
5. Join bag body rectangles along side and bottom edges. Press seams open. Diagram 3
6. Do the same with lining pieces. Leaving a small opening on one side seam for turning.
7. Sew bottom corners as per Diagram 4.
8. Insert bag body into lining. They will be right sides together. Sew together around top edge.
9. Turn bag right side out through opening in lining side seam. Close opening. Push lining inside bag. Top stitch around top of bag 1/4" from edge through all layers.
10. Press creases into bag sides. Insert a cardboard rectangle into bag to reinforce bag bottom. Sew button to front of bag.

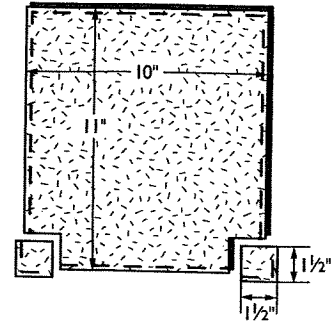
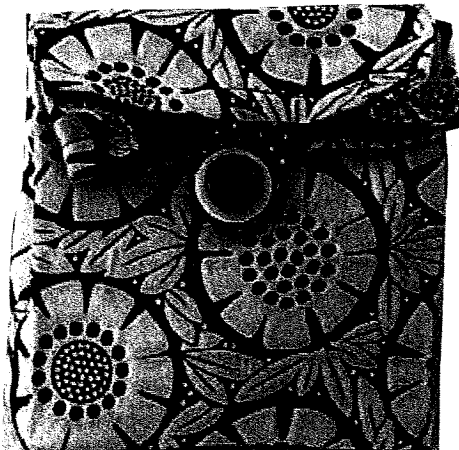

## HOT BEVERAGE WRAPPER

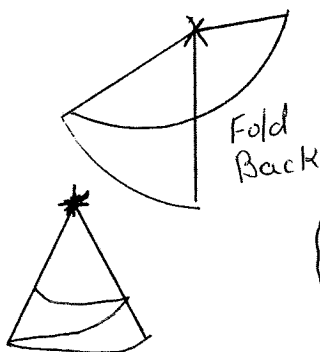
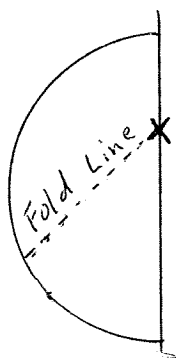
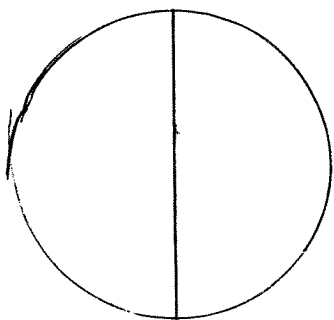
Requirements: Scraps of Material  
Scrap of Batting

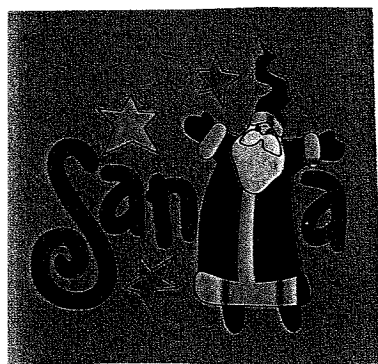
1. Trace pattern.
2. Cut 2 of material
3. Cut 1 of batting
4. Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam around leaving an opening to turn right side out.
5. Clip corners and curved edges.
6. Turn right side out and close opening.
7. Top stitch around edge.
8. Press along marked fold lines.
9. Sew Velcro in place.



## CHRISTMAS TREE NAPKINS

1. Cut two 13" circles
2. Sew piping around circle.
3. Place second circle on top and sew around leaving an opening to turn.
4. Close opening and press.
5. Fold circle in half
6. Sew button 5" from the edge on fold.
7. Fold up from button.
8. Fold overlay back on itself.



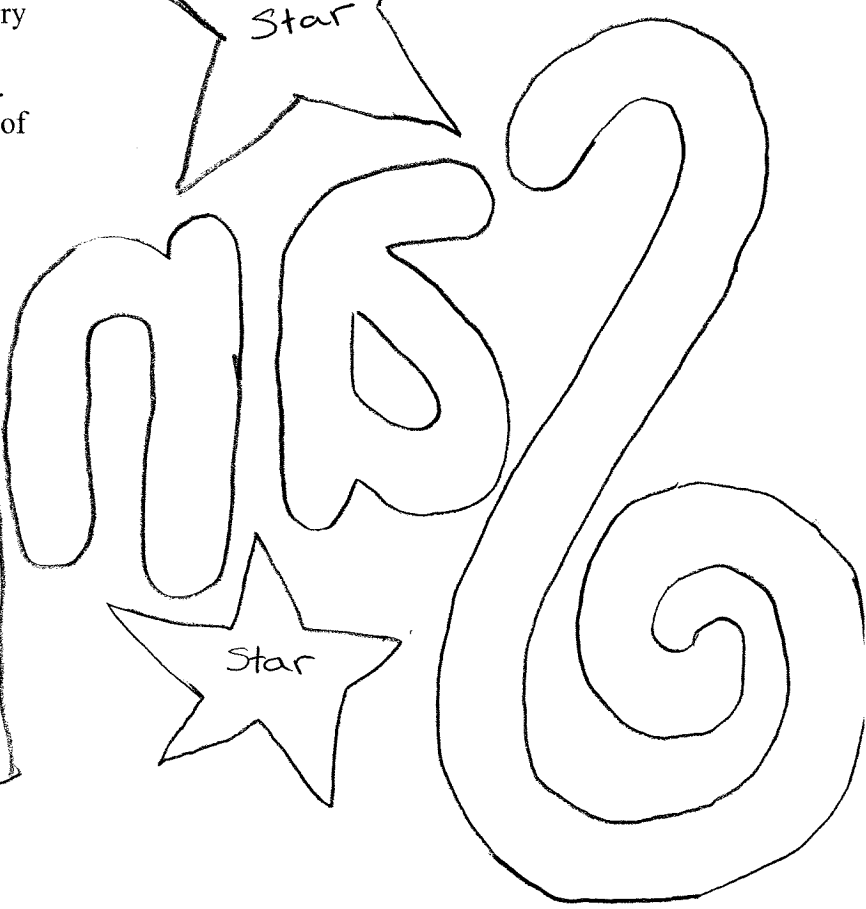
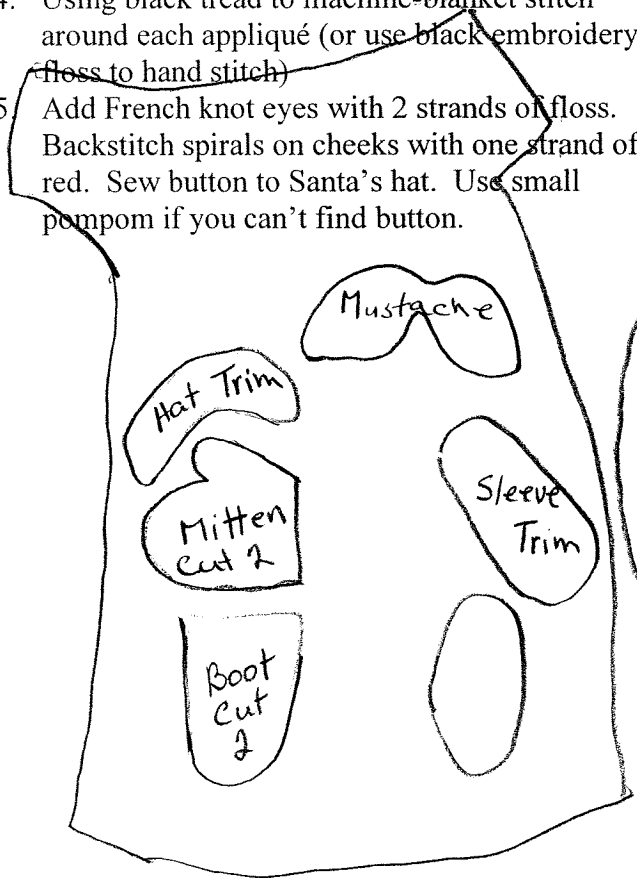


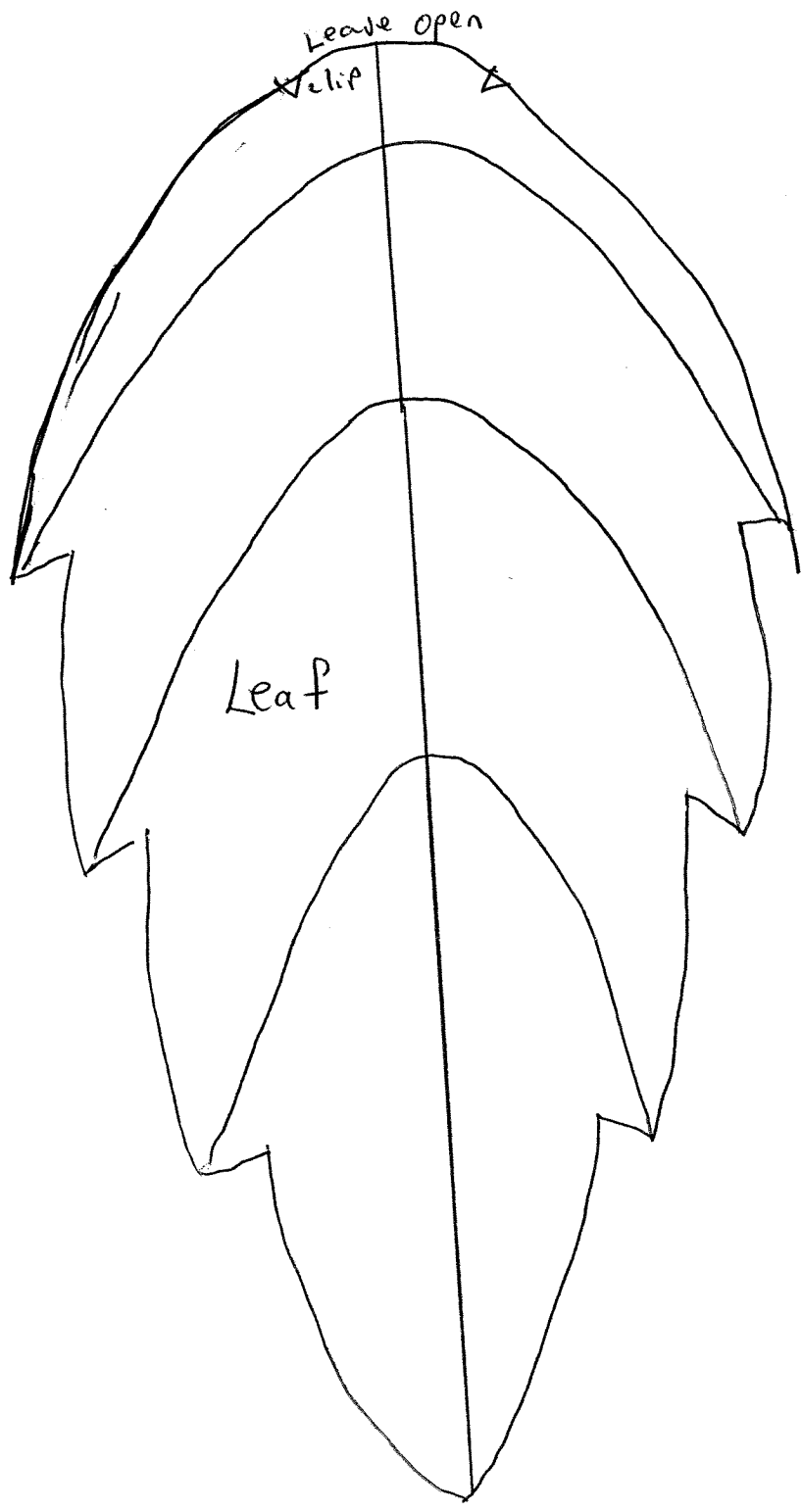
## SANTA TEA TOWEL

### Materials

- Lightweight paper-backed fusible web
- Fabric scraps: green print, red print, multicolor, assorted gold prints, cream print solid black and solid pink.
- Tea towel
- Embroidery floss black and red
- Peppermint swirl button

1. Trace the patterns leaving ½" between shapes. Cut the shapes apart leaving some web around each shape.
2. Fuse the shapes to the wrong side of the fabrics. Cut on the traced lines and remove the paper backing.
3. Place the towel right side up and position the appliqué pieces on the towel. Fuse in place.
4. Using black tread to machine-blanket stitch around each appliqué (or use black embroidery floss to hand stitch)
5. Add French knot eyes with 2 strands of floss. Backstitch spirals on cheeks with one strand of red. Sew button to Santa's hat. Use small pompom if you can't find button.



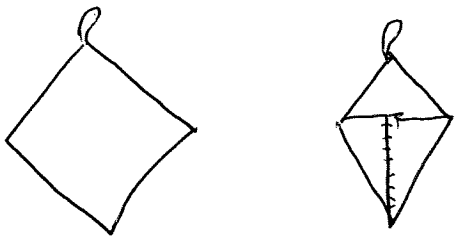


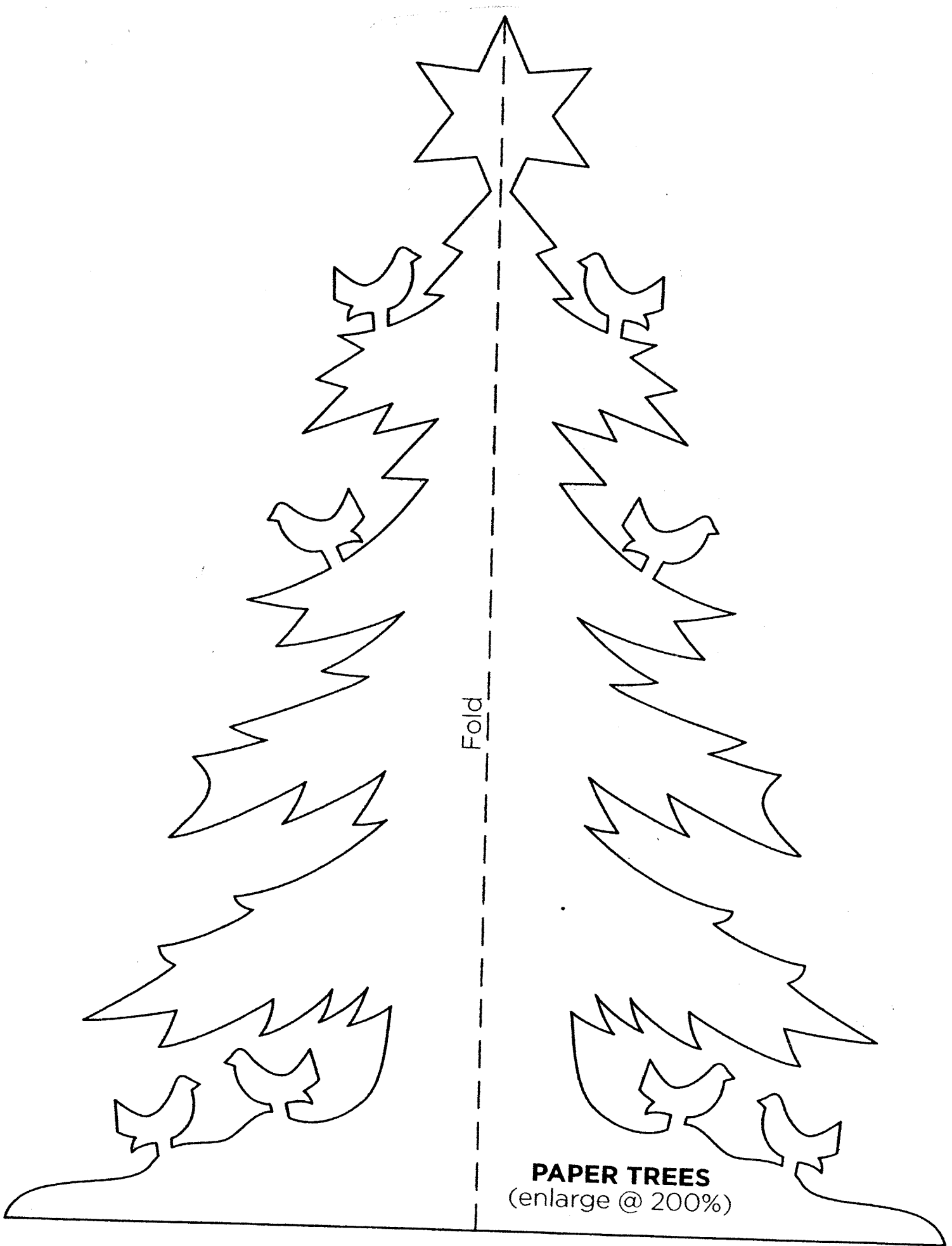
## Circle of Snow

- 1) Layer 3 snowflake patterns in 2 sizes on a circular wreath form. Cover form in white felt if desired or paint.
- 2) So the snowflakes hold their shape cut them from stiff craft felt or apply stiffening spray and from white felt, then glue them together.
- 3) Adhere the snowflakes to the wreath. For depth apply stacks of snowflakes using mounting squares between snowflakes.
- 4) Mist with spray glue + sprinkle on glitter.

## Scissor Holder

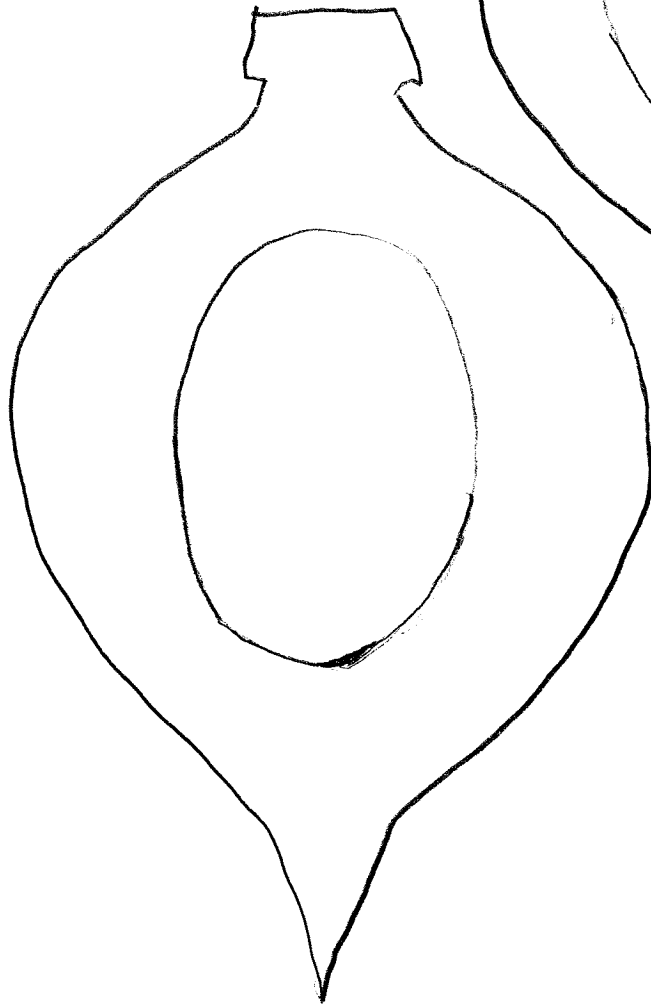
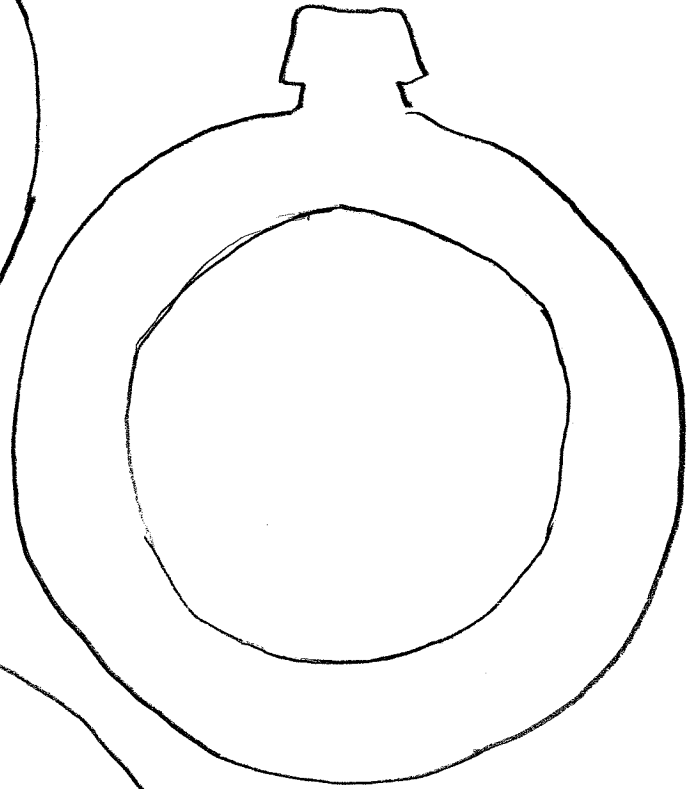
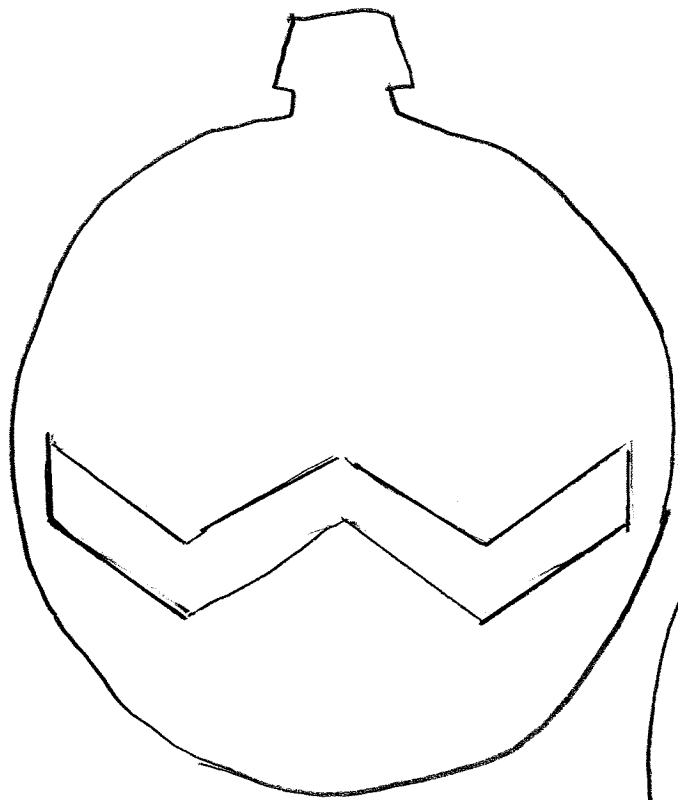
- 1) Make or buy a square pot holder.
- 2) Place on point with loop at top.
- 3) Bring 2 side points to centre to form a cone.
- 4) Sew centre seam closed. by hand.
