Cost will include your paper pattern, all your hardware, interfacing, stabilizer and the odicoat to put on the outside to protect it.

The only thing you need to purchase or get from your stash is the fabric you want to make it out of and zippers. Fabric can be any cotton, batik or denim. You will need up to 3 different coordinating fabrics totalling 1 meter. Fat quarters will work in this pattern.
